Essential Job Functions:

- Attend monthly meetings.
- Participate in monthly station duty.
- Maintain a state of readiness.
- Provide protection of life and property.
- Respond to emergency calls and other emergency situations when notified.
- Suppress, control and extinguish fires.
- Perform salvage, overhaul and cleanup activities.
- Administer first aid, or other medical care according to level of certification.
- Assist career department personnel.
- Prepare and complete forms and reports.
- Participate in organized community service activities.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Minimum Requirements:

- High school diploma or GED.
- Must pass a physical agility test.
- Must be at least eighteen (18) years old.
- Must pass background check.
- Valid Georgia driver's license.
- Be a resident of Glynn County.

Benefits for volunteer firefighters:

- Satisfaction of helping others in need.
- Uniforms, turnout gear, and equip.
- All the necessary training.
- Worker's compensation coverage.
- Access to physical fitness equipment.
- Membership opportunities in the Georgia Firefighters Association & in the Georgia Firefighter's Pension Fund.
- Opportunities to attend classes at the Georgia Fire Academy (FREE).
- Opportunity to become a certified firefighter.
- Service awards & recognition.
- Camaraderie!!!
